## Legacy grant helps Museum Purchase a new Microfilm Reader

The museum has installed a new Scan Pro 2000 microfilm reader, scanner, and printer in the research area. Thanks go to an Arts and Cultural Heritage Grant provided by the Minnesota Historical Society with funds provided from the 2008 Legacy Amendment voted on by the citizens of Minnesota.

 $T \hat{E} \hat{R}$  This new microfilm reader works in a similar way to the old one, but has far superior im-ND & age quality, the ability to clip and paste different columns to a document, image clarity I functions, and the ability to search a page for a term or word. Documents can be saved to a flash drive for ease of use. This machine and its accompanying software has many

other new features that the staff is still discovering.

Researchers will find this reader a great improvement over the older machine. The computer that it is attached to was purchased by the Murray County Historical Society for patron use and the printer was provided by the county, making this a truly collaborative effort to increase accessibility to the archives for researchers and the general public.

Researchers who have used our archive this spring include the Larson, Addy, Sheeren, Lynch, Miller, and Hanson families, as well as information about the old Shetek Marine Building.


## **Updates on the Textile Inventory Project**

Last December the museum received an Arts and Cultural Heritage Grant through the Legacy fund. Torri McKinney and Gaylene Chapman have been working on the project and have over 800 items processed so far. Dozens that are beyond our ability to preserve and are not accessioned items have been set aside for donation to the Midwest Conservation Alliance for use as educational materials for conservator students.

As you can see by the before and after photos, we are making great headway. The metal rack for hanging items in the photo bottom left was made and donated by Jim Surprenant. We are extremely grateful for his talent and generosity. The metal storage shelves, where the boxes are stored along the back wall, were purchased and installed by volunteer Brian Harmsen. We are so thankful for his help on this project. One thing that we do lack at this point is more metal storage shelves for the boxes to be stored on. We are actively seeking donations to purchase more and need approximately \$500.00 to purchase an adequate amount of them.
